ABOUT SISTERS BY CHOICE

Sisters By Choice (SBC) was founded in 1989 by Rogsbert F. Phillips-Reed, MD, FACS, an Atlanta based breast surgical oncologist. Early on, Dr. Phillips-Reed saw the need for programs that increased the public's knowledge and awareness of breast cancer as a means to decrease mortality and morbidity rates. Dr. Phillips-Reed also wanted to improve the delivery of breast health services and support services. Initially formed as a breast cancer support group, SBC has evolved into a multi-faceted organization serving women in Georgia. Realizing there are health disparities surrounding access to quality breast care. SBC launched The Mobile Breast Clinic in 2015. This clinic facilitates remote screening and diagnostic services, treatment referrals, education and access to clinical trials to medically under-served women. For 30 years, SBC has provided free breast health seminars and symposiums that assemble world-renowned medical experts delivering state-of-the-art breast cancer information.
