The 14th Annual Oncology Nursing Symposium provides an intimate learning environment where the varied facets of oncology nursing will be explored. Nationally recognized speakers will review clinical experiences and provide updates on current research in nursing practice. The symposium will update healthcare professionals on the emerging trends in oncology nursing clinical practice and research and will provide participants with practical strategies and hands-on tools to improve their nursing practice. Our theme this year is *We Served, We Survived, We Conquered - We Are Oncology Nursing.*

We anticipate attendance of 350+ oncology nurses, Advanced Practice Registered Nurses, and other health care professionals involved with the care of oncology and hematology patients from the southeast, including metro Atlanta community practices, academic centers and nursing schools.
